Repeat the incisions as before, this time cutting through the muscle layer to a point just below... When you reach the area just below the arms, turn your scissors and make horizontal ...

Dissection Instructions. 1. Place the frog in the dissecting pan ventral side up. 2. Use scissors to lift the abdominal muscles away from the body cavity. Cut along the midline of the body to the forelimbs. 3. Make transverse (horizontal) cuts near the arms and legs. 4. Life the flaps of the body wall and pin back.

Place your frog on its back and pin it to the dissecting tray. 2. Lift the frog's skin with forceps between the rear legs. 3. Make a small cut through the lifted skin with the scalpel. Put on safety goggles, gloves, and a lab apron. Place a frog on a dissection tray. To determine the frog's sex, look at the hand digits, or fingers, on its forelegs. A male frog usually has thick pads on its "thumbs," which is one external difference between the sexes, as shown in the diagram below.
