The new guidelines do not have any major changes, but here are some of the basics: No more than 120 compressions per minute with a minimum of 100. Chest compressions for adults should be no more than 2.4 inches and at least 2 inches.

Do Chest Compressions. Place the heel of your hand on the center of the person's chest. Place the heel of your other hand on top of your first hand, lacing fingers together. Keep arms straight and your shoulders directly over your hands. Push hard and fast, compressing chest at least 2 inches.

### **Tips for Proper CPR Technique in Adults - WebMD**

The 2015 guidelines still recommend traditional CPR cycles of 30 chest compressions to two rescue breaths for one-rescuer CPR in all age groups and for two-rescuer CPR in adults. The 15:2 ratio of compressions to breaths remains in the 2015 guidelines for two-rescuer CPR for children and infants.

### **New CPR Guidelines 2015**

Then press the shock button on the AED machine to deliver the first shock. Immediately following the shock, begin CPR for 5 cycles (or approximately 2 minutes). Begin CPR for 2 minutes (5 cycles). Perform CPR for 5 cycles of 30 compressions to 2 breaths.

### **2019 American Heart Association Focused Update on ...**

Early CPR that emphasize chest compressions (new guidelines AHA 20120). Rapid defibrillation if indicated. Effective advanced life support. Integrated post-cardiac arrest care. When these chain are implemented in an affective way, survival rate can approach 50% following witnessed out-hospital ventricular fibrillation (VF) arrest (fibrillation of the heart).

### **New Guidelines Adult Basic Life Support, CPR CAB (AHA 2010 ...**

This 2019 focused update to the American Heart Association pediatric basic life support guidelines follows the 2019 systematic review of the effects of dispatcher-assisted cardiopulmonary resuscitation (DA-CPR) on survival of infants and children with out-of-hospital cardiac arrest.

### **2019 American Heart Association Focused Update on ...**

In the AHA paper published in 2012, the prescribed rate of compression was at least 100 compressions per minute. However, in the updated 2015 version of the CPR guideline, a compression rate of 100-120 per minute is now recommended.

Remember – compressing the chest is the most important part of CPR. Personal protection during CPR Ordinary household items (such as handkerchiefs, tissues and tea towels) provide no useful protection from transmission of disease and complicate the process of performing CPR.
